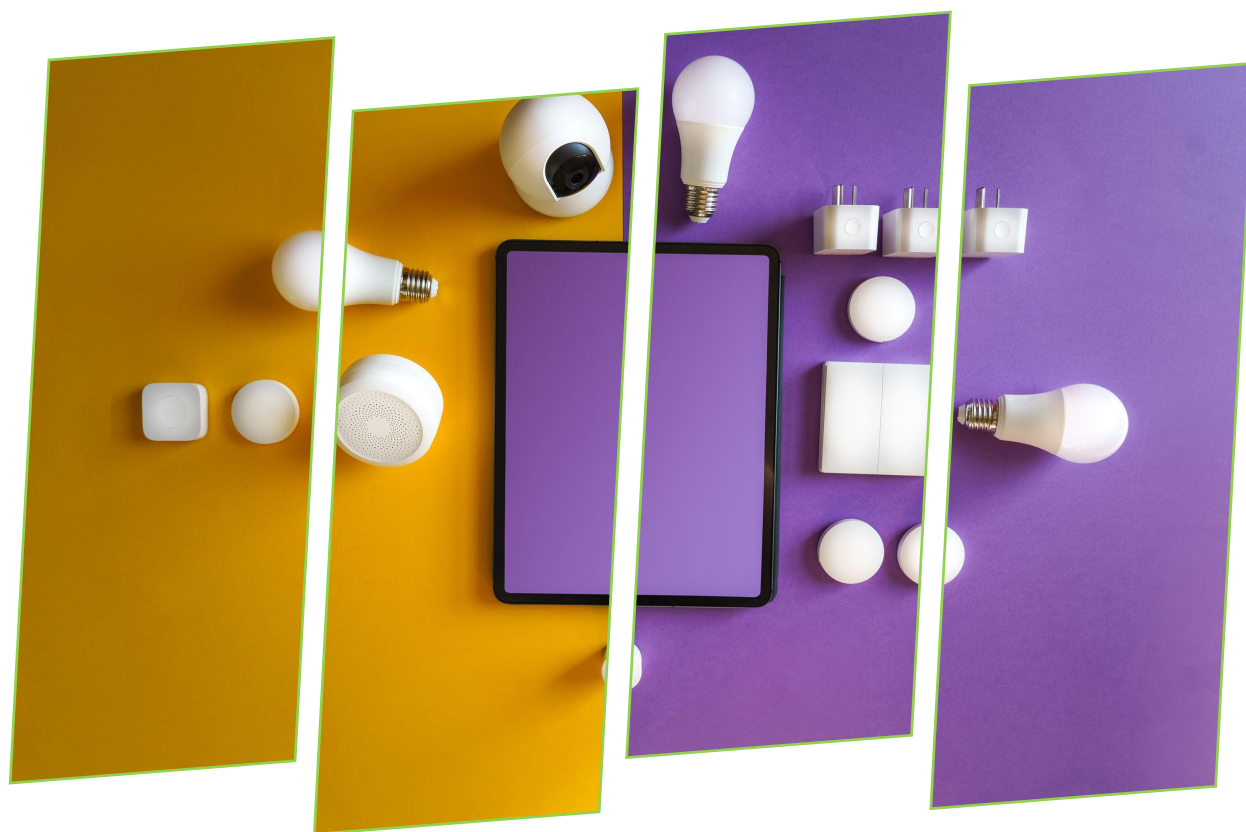




Implementation Arrangements for Conformity Assessment System for the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products

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Announcement of the State Administration for Market Regulation and the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology on the Release of the "Implementation Arrangements for Conformity Assessment System for the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products"

In accordance with the "Administrative Measures for the Restriction of the Use of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products" (Order No. 32 of the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology, the National Development and Reform Commission, the Ministry of Science and Technology, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Environmental Protection, the Ministry of Commerce, the General Administration of Customs, and the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine), the State Administration for Market Regulation and the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology have organized the formulation of the "Implementation Arrangements for Conformity Assessment System for the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products" (hereinafter referred to as the "Implementation Arrangements"), which is hereby announced. Products listed in the "Qualification Management Catalogue for the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products (First Batch)" that are manufactured or imported after November 1, 2019, shall meet the requirements of the "Implementation Arrangements".

Implementation Arrangements for Conformity Assessment System for the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products

To implement the "Administrative Measures for the Restriction of the Use of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products" (Order No. 32 of the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology, the National Development and Reform Commission, the Ministry of Science and Technology, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Environmental Protection, the Ministry of Commerce, the General Administration of Customs, and the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine), strengthen the management of the "Qualification Management Catalogue for the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Products" (hereinafter referred to as the "Qualification Management Catalogue"), restrict the use of hazardous substances in electrical and electronic products from the source, reduce environmental pollution after product disposal, increase the supply of green products, and promote green consumption, the State Administration for Market Regulation, in conjunction with the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology, has proposed the following implementation arrangements for the conformity assessment activities of hazardous substances restriction for electrical and electronic products included in the "Qualification Management Catalogue".

I. Methods of Conformity Assessment

(1) The conformity assessment system for the restriction of hazardous substances in electrical and electronic products includes two methods: the voluntary certification for the restriction of hazardous substances in electrical and electronic products promoted uniformly by the state (hereinafter referred to as "State-promoted Voluntary Certification") and the supplier's declaration of conformity for the restriction of hazardous substances in electrical and electronic products (hereinafter referred to as "Self-declaration"). State-promoted Voluntary Certification refers to the certification activities voluntarily applied for by enterprises, certified by a third-party certification body to prove that the electrical and electronic products meet the requirements of relevant hazardous substance restriction standards and technical specifications, and uniformly promoted and regulated by the state. Self-declaration refers to the conformity assessment activities where suppliers (including manufacturers, authorized representatives, etc.) independently adopt reasonable methods to complete conformity assessment and submit product conformity
