This document aligns with the related technical content of the *United Nations Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals* (GHS Rev.11).

This document replaces *GB 30000.7-2013 Rules for classification and labelling of chemicals - Part 7: Flammable liquids*.

Compared with GB 30000.7-2013, the main technical changes are as follows:

- The provisions are modified to be mandatory in whole;
- Deleted the normative reference “GB 6944-2012” and updated the normative references;
- Modified the introductory text in Chapter 3 “Terms and definitions”, changing “GB 13690” to “GB 30000.1”;
- Modified Note 4 of Table 1 “Classification of flammable liquids”, changing “aerosols are not classified as flammable liquids” to “aerosols and chemicals under pressure are not classified as flammable liquids”;
- Modified the introductory text of Chapter 5 “Decision logic and guidance”;
- Modified the content of “6.5 Precautionary statement” in Chapter 6 to align the expression with the relevant content of GHS (Rev. 11);
- Modified the content of “6.6 Product identifier” and “6.7 Supplier identification” in Chapter 6 to align the expression with the GB 30000 series standards;
- Modified the flame graphic symbol in the informative Appendix A “A.1 Decision logic”;
- Changed “calculated by the methods listed in A.2.4” to “calculated by the methods listed in A.2.3” in the informative Appendix A “A.2 Guidance”;
- Added content on using open-cup flash point for result determination in the informative Appendix A “A.2 Guidance”;

- Updated the relevant standards for flash point determination methods of flammable liquids in the informative Appendix A “A.2 Guidance”;
- Updated the relevant standards for initial boiling point determination methods of flammable liquids in the informative Appendix A “A.2 Guidance”;
- Updated the allocation of label elements for flammable liquids in the normative Appendix B;
- Modified the flame graphic symbol in the normative Appendix C;
- Changed “GB 13690” to “GB 30000.1”, “the codes for hazard statements see GHS Annex 3” to “the codes for hazard statements shall comply with Table D.1 and Table D.2”, and “the codes for precautionary statements see GHS Annex 3” to “the codes for precautionary statements shall comply with Table D.1 and Table D.2” in the normative Appendix D;
- Modified the hazard statements in “D.1.2.2” and precautionary statements in “D.1.3.2.1” of the normative Appendix D to align with the relevant content of GHS (Rev. 11);
- Modified the flame graphic symbol in “D.3” of the normative Appendix D;
- Modified the statements for “Prevention”, “Emergency response”, “Storage”, “Disposal”, and “General precautionary statements” in “D.3” of the normative Appendix D to align with the relevant content of GHS (Rev. 11);
- Modified the flame graphic symbol in the label examples of the normative Appendix E;
- Modified the precautionary statements in the label examples of the normative Appendix E to align with the relevant content of GHS (Rev. 11).

1 Scope

This document specifies the classification criteria, decision logic and guidance, and labelling of flammable liquids.

This document is applicable to the classification and labelling of flammable liquids in accordance with the *United Nations Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals* (Rev. 11) (hereinafter referred to as GHS).
